


Early Head Start is a federally funded, locally administered program that provides quality, comprehensive early childhood development services to pregnant women, infants and toddlers.

Early Head Start is Comprehensive

Offered in Centers and Home-Based settings - responsive to the needs of community and families

Year round program, for at least 6 hours, often combined with child care for longer hours of care Enrolled children are provided with all necessary supplies, including diapers and formula

Uses a research-based school readiness curriculum and conducts ongoing assessments

Ensure updated physical, dental, vision and hearing screening and any necessary care and follow-up

Welcomes all children, including those with disabilities and staff are well trained to managed children with IEPs

Empowers parents as their child's first and most important teacher




Two Months
